In our food room we need all personal hygiene items and laundry soap.

We applied for and received money from a grant from the Archdiocesan Council of St. Vincent dePaul in the sum of \$1,138.00 to be used for the storage of food for the needy. We are able to obtain shelving and refrigeration and a new freezer for our food room. We are very thankful for this grant. Food distribution to families has increased by 5%. We are very blessed for the support from all of you to help us help them.

SECOND EASTER

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER: *Today's account of the confrontation between the apostles and the members of the Sanhedrin is an example of a story from the early Church that is entertaining and instructive. While reading of the beginnings of the Church, Christians learn of the humorous, tragic, and inspiring events of their past. The apostles teach in the name of Jesus. But what does it mean to teach in the savior's name? Is starting a sentence with "In the name of Jesus..." enough? The answer is in Peter's response to the Sanhedrin. Teaching in Jesus' name means bearing witness to his teachings and story, whatever the consequences. It means facing down opponents to tell of the astounding reversal that God vindicated a man who had been tried and executed.*

It also may mean continuing a mission when those in power do not believe in your words and actions. Considering the Twelve to be false prophets, the Sanhedrin had forbidden them to spread the news of Jesus. Their disobedience brought imprisonment. Today's reading from Acts does not tell that a death sentence was nearly imposed on the apostles. In this story of our Christian family, the apostles stand against a combined might while teaching in the name of Jesus.

Why do the disciples find joy in dishonor? What experience of yours might be similar? When have you stood up to someone or something, convinced that any other course of action would be disobedience to God? Or imagine how you might.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

In today's Gospel, several disciples find Jesus on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias after a night of trying to catch fish. Jesus fixes breakfast for his friends and then talks with Peter, Jesus asks him three times "Do you love me?" and three times Peter answers yes. Peter's conviction to Jesus became stronger with each "yes".

How do you think Peter felt when Jesus kept asking him the same question? Jesus continues to ask each of us the same question, How can we today, answer yes to Jesus with the same conviction that Peter had that day?
