**FAMILY FAITH SHARING:**

**Matthew 6:24-34**

This is another passage from the Gospel of Matthew in which we find Jesus teaching his disciples. He is telling them (and us!) that we should not worry about our life - what we will eat or drink or wear. God created the world and everything in it - He loves and cares for all of creation., including birds and wild flowers. God takes care of them, and he will certainly provide for us and take care of our needs.

***This passage tells us about God's great love for us. How does it make you feel when you think about God's incredible love for you? Can you think of something you might do to thank God for loving you so much?***

***Perhaps it could be something to help God take care of the earth ...***

**LITURGICAL SPIRITUALITY:**

In time of suffering we may feel alone and forgotten by everyone, But the prophet Isaiah tells us that God never forgets us. God has intimate knowledge of our troubled hearts.

Paul did not regard himself as anything more than a servant of Christ. He warned the community not to judge one another, because they often failed to have insight into other people's actions. In time the Lord would "bring to light the things now hidden in darkness" (1 Cor 4:5b). Then each one would receive commendation from God.

Jesus taught his disciples that it is impossible to serve two masters. We must choose between serving God or earthly material goods. As servants of the Lord, we should not be overly concerned about our physical needs but take a lesson from the birds and an flowers of the field. If God provides for them, we should be confident that God will provide for us.

**For Reflection: Do I work for God's reign or for earthly riches? Do I trust God with all my concerns?**

**Departure: Saturday, March 20**—New Orleans, Here we come!

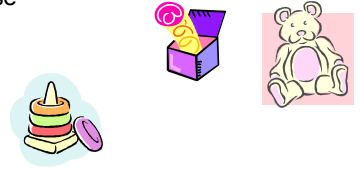
