FAMILY FAITH SHARING:

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Today's Gospel is familiar. It's what we call the "Sermon on the Mount." We also refer to this Scripture as the "Beatitudes." For us as Christians, the Beatitudes are as important as the Ten Commandments, but they are not easy to understand.

Which one of these Beatitudes do you understand because you have experienced it? Describe how you experienced it. Which one would you like to understand and act on? Why? Is there one that is scary to you? Which one and why?

LITURGICAL SPIRITUALITY:

We often boast of our advantages: power, success, and affluence. Paul says that if we must boast, we should boast in the Lord. Everything we have comes from Christ: wisdom, justice, sanctification, and redemption. God's care and concern are for those who, in the eyes of the world, count for nothing: the uneducated, deprived, and despised.

The remnant of Israel is the faithful, humble people who find their refuge in the Lord. If they secure justice for the oppressed, feed the hungry, free the captives, and protect the stranger, widow, and orphan, they are assured of a place in God's reign.

Jesus takes us to the mountaintop to give us new insight. Are we poor in spirit? God's reign will be ours. Are we full of sorrow? Consolation will be ours. Are we oppressed and lowly? We will obtain justice. Are we hungry and thirsty? We will be satisfied. Are we merciful? We will be shown mercy. Are we single-hearted peacemakers: If so, the kingdom of heaven is ours. How blest we are!
