**THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

It is easy to say to Christ, "I will follow you," when the road leads to power and glory. But are we willing to follow him when the way is difficult? Can we follow him to the cross? Can everything in our lives take second place to God's reign? When we truly live the life of Christ, we are inviting others to follow a similar path.

Jesus' disciples failed to understand this. They wanted to "call down fire from heaven" on those who traveled another path. Jesus reprimanded them for failing to follow the way of love. Discipleship doesn't mean forcing everyone to be like us. It means identifying with the poor and suffering even if they don't look like us or act like us. It means resisting our tendencies toward selfishness and pouring out our lives for the sake of others. If we are unwilling to share with others, then there is no room for us at the table and no place for us in God's reign.

How has Christ shown me the path to life when the way was hard? What price have I paid for living my Christian life?
