CPR ALERT Someone in the parish asked us about having a CPR class here at St. Charles. In checking around we found a firefighter, trained as an American Heart CPR instructor, who is willing to come to St. Charles to teach CPR to adults 18 years and older. We would need 8 participants and he would charge \$15 a person attending (this is a great price as Red Cross would charge \$44 a person.) He would teach adult, child and AED training. FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In today's Gospel Jesus says a prayer of thanks to the Father for those who follow him with childlike faith and an open heart. Jesus tells us that he himself leads people to the Father and shows us what the Father is like. He invites us to come to him without fear, for he is meek and humble of heart, and will gently teach us to be like him. He invites us to trust him completely.

Can you think of a time or situation when someone had to trust you? Why did that person have to trust you? How did you react — or reward their trust? Have you ever had to trust someone else? Why did you have to trust that person? How did the other person react to your trust? When we trust Jesus/God, he responds by being gentle and loving and, in the process, teaches us to trust him and learn from him even more

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

"Rejoice," the prophet exhorts us when we feel disheartened. Our king comes to us not proudly seated on a royal throne but humbly on the back of a donkey. He will break the warrior's bow and command peace to the nations. He is "gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."

Jesus rejoices in God's love. This love is a mystery to those who suppose that they are too sophisticated and wise. It is the humble who welcome Jesus, the "little ones" with the heart of a child who understand. Because they do not esteem themselves as being more important than others, they can accept the love that God reveals. Jesus invites all who feel weighed down by life's trials to come to him. He will not yoke us like slaves but will ease the sorrows we carry in our hearts.

Whatever God sends us is made to fit our needs exactly. God promises fidelity to the end of time. Even though we die, our mortal bodies will be raised to life through the Spirit who dwells in us as in a holy temple.

PORTLAND METALS

Several parishioners have mentioned concern about the debris and noise pollution from this business located on 42nd Ave. just doors away from St. Charles. 42nd Ave. business association has presented a petition to the City of Portland with the names of 25 or so neighborhood businesses to encourage the city to shut this business down or enforce the zoning laws associated with the property.

This is what we know:

Portland Metals has a conditional permit to run an industrial type business, however the permit DOES NOT allow outdoor storage or intake to take place, both of which are occurring regularly. The company is currently being fined \$1000 per month for permit violation, however from what concerned parties have observed, no change in business has taken place. Organizers have now taken concerns to the Bureau of Environmental Services who is also investigating the business.

Because this is such an issue for many St. Charles members, we are asking you to please sign the petition located at the entrance of the church. We will make sure these petitions are turned over to the city by July 20th. It's vital that pressure continue to be placed on this business to insure that the neighborhood livability is not further compromised.
