**FAMILY FAITH SHARING:**

Today's Gospel reading is from the Book of John, and in it we find Jesus telling his disciples that he will ask God, his Father, to send the Holy Spirit to live in and with the disciples forever. He also tells them that very soon they will no longer be able to actually see him, but that they should continue to love him and obey his commandments. The greatest of the commandments that Jesus gave his disciples (and us!) is to "love one another as I have Loved you." If we could obey this great commandment, we would not break any of the Ten Commandments, because out of love, we would be loving to others in every situation we face. ***Do you find yourself picking and choosing whom you will love? How is God calling you to love in your life? Can you remember a time when you really felt God's love? Share your memory.***

**SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:**

Before Jesus left the earth, he comforted his followers by telling them that the Spirit of truth would remain with them to console and guide them. But soon after, many felt abandoned and alienated. There were "insiders" and "outsiders." The Samaritans were definitely among those on the outside. In people's minds there was no such thing as a "good" Samaritan.

Jesus' attitude toward the outsider was surprising. He regarded everyone as his brother and sister, worthy of the gospel. Following Jesus' example, Philip went to preach the good news to the people of Samaria. When the apostles heard how eagerly these foreigners accepted the Lord, they prayed with them that they would receive the Spirit.

In his letter, Peter addressed people who were maligned because of their way of life. He told them to be ready with a reply if anyone asked them the reason for their hope. Though the Spirit of Truth might not be accepted by all, if they loved Jesus, they would obey his command to love one another.

**For reflection:** What are my feelings toward people of different faith traditions and cultures? How does the Spirit help me to adjust my attitude?
