LISTENING SEASON—ISSUE—CHILD SAFETY A few weeks ago, Fr. Agnelo spoke during the 11 a.m. mass regarding the issue of child safety. One important piece that was not included in his talk was that this issue was raised during the Parish Listening Season. The Pastoral Council and the Relational Development Team are beginning to look at the internal issues that were raised this winter and will be reporting to you the status and plans that come from our reflection. It is our hope that parents can address this first concern for our children and will bring to the staff any suggestions that might help them keep their kids and all parishioners happy and safe.—

The following is a summation of Fr. Agnelo's talk. We want to first make it known that there is a nursery available during this mass for children 1 yr-preschool. Mass is a time of quiet and reflection and is often difficult for young ones. We encourage you to use this service, which is free and located in room 15a. If you would rather not use the nursery and your child needs to move around, is crying or talking out loud, please use the cry room. There are speakers in this room to allow you to still follow the liturgy. We ask you this out of respect for all participants in our Sunday worship.

The following issues are ones of safety. We ask you to not send an elementary age child to use the restroom without an adult during the mass. The halls are not supervised during this time and it is not prudent to have a child wandering alone.

The next issue is the gym during coffee and rolls time. Safety during this time has been a concern for several years. Often children are running in the gym, circling the tables and clearly unsupervised. This is an issue not only for them, but for other parishioners. This social time is an important ministry that allows parishioners to connect with one another in a relaxed atmosphere. If it is so noisy or the chairs are being bumped into, it makes this experience unpleasant.

We have also found children running in the halls. Even as a group, this is also not appropriate. We ask that children remain with their parents and parents that you supervise your kids.

In a community as diverse as ours it is important that we listen to one another and respect the needs of everyone, both big and small.

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

In every age and in every place, the church continues to renew itself. The struggle then as now is how to be faithful to the vision that was handed on in the past as we move ahead to the future. The early church was faced with this dilemma. As more gentiles came into the church, some Christians questioned whether those of another tradition should be burdened by Jewish religious practices. Paul and Barnabas did not make this decision alone. Along with the apostles and elders at Jerusalem they were guided by the Spirit, who continues to direct our judgments.

John of Patmos saw a vision of a New Jerusalem coming forth from the hand of God. The radiant, holy city was securely built on the foundation of Israel and the apostles. God the Almighty and the Lamb were their guiding light.

Jesus promised to dwell forever with those who lived in love and fidelity to his word. Jesus' followers should not be distressed over his departure. They should be at peace because the Spirit would be sent as their advocate and helper. Just as Jesus led them in the past, the Spirit would continue to be in their midst to direct and teach them.

Am I confident of the Spirit's presence in my life? What evidence do I have?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

Today we hear Jesus tell the disciples that he is going to send them the Holy Spirit to help them remember all that they have been taught. The Holy Spirit will guide them and strengthen them so that they can continue the Father's work. Jesus knew that the disciples did not completely understand everything he had taught them.

In which Sacraments does the Holy Spirit come to us? Do we understand everything Jesus taught? How does the Holy Spirit teach and remind us today?

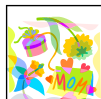
