PENTECOST

PENTECOST:

Pentecost! Just as the breath of God animated the first human beings, the mighty wind of Sinai re-created them into one people of God. No law could unite persons of every nation, race, and tribe. When people gather together to pray and seek God's guidance, the breath of God and the flames of divine wisdom widen the horizons of their minds so that prejudices disappear, and the barriers between them vanish. Then everyone can sing the praises of God in one voice.

Paul understood the unity that Christ intended for the church. Although there were many members with unique gifts and different ministries, there was only one Spirit, one Lord of all. Whether Jew or Gentile, slave or free, woman or man, black, red, white, yellow or brown, all were one people baptized into one body.

"Peace be with you," Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit into each of his followers again. The tiny spark became a great blaze burning with God's love and mercy. Cold hearts were warmed by God's grace. Love and pardon were offered to all held bound by hatred and unforgiveness. Everything must be done for the common good of all, for without God's Spirit all human efforts would return to dust. The Great 50 Days has ended, but the task of bringing about God's reign has just begun.

Pray with the psalmist: "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth!" Ask what you can do to participate in this work.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

In this Sunday's Gospel passage, we hear that the disciples are all together in one room, the doors locked, and they are afraid. Jesus comes and stands in the room with them. "Peace be with you." He breathes on them and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." The disciples are not afraid and go outside with Jesus.

Can you call on this gift of the Holy Spirit when you need strength in your life? How? What times in your life could you have asked for strength and didn't?
