FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

John relates Jesus' death on the cross with the divine glory he shares with his Father. This is a stunning and ironic revision of the Gospel writer's inheritance from Judaism. For John, Jesus is exalted on the cross. What would have been a humiliating death became a means of revelation greater than prophecy or God's gift of the law at Mount Sinai.

Our readings today conclude with the love command. But there is more to Jesus' words than the command to love. He also claims "all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." One way to show love for one another and for the world God loves is to work and pray that no one is left behind.

What do you find glorious about the Easter season?

What are your thoughts about Judas and the role he played in Jesus' death?

How can a strict literal reading of the Bible be misleading?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

In this Gospel we hear how Jesus wants us to love. Jesus says, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another".

How did Jesus show his love for us? Why is it hard, sometimes, for us to love others? When is it the hardest for you to follow this commandment? Why we don't follow this commandment what happens?
