Zacchaeus wasn't just a tax collector; he was the chief tax collector, regarded as the ultimate sinner. Zacchaeus gained his wealth by lining his pockets with the exorbitant tariffs he charged his fellow citizens. Yet he was attracted to Jesus, so much so that he was even willing to go out on a limb to see him. Jesus did not consider him unworthy of his attention. He came to seek the sinner and rescue the lost. The people were quick to judge Zacchaeus, but he promised to give to the poor and make amends to anyone he had cheated. Jesus said that salvation had come to Zacchaeus because of his faith. The psalmist prayed: "The Lord is slow to anger and of great kindness, compassionate toward all." Paul prayed that every one would be made worthy at the coming of the Lord. God was merciful and would overlook the sins of those who repented. Because the imperishable spirit of God is within us, God loves us and spares us.

For Reflection: *Have I repented of any misdeeds I have committed today?*

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

This story of redemption in Luke allows the reader to see themselves in a situation that we're all familiar with. Wanting to be a part of the group, wanting to fit in but not feeling adequate to do so. Here Zacchaeus wants to see Jesus. He knows that Jesus has helped others find a new life and wants to have Jesus not only fix his problem, but to be an active part of finding redemption in his own life.

Are we willing to look like a fool to find redemption in our lives? Are we willing to risk our reputation to admit to our guilt and find a new way to repair the damage we have done to others in our lives?
