FAMILY FAITH SHARING Matthew 22:15-21

This parable from the Gospel of Matthew points out the relationship between being a good citizen and being a good Christian. All of us have the responsibility to be good citizens of our country. This includes voting, paying taxes, protecting the rights of others, and living by the laws set down by the government. But, sometimes the laws set down in the Bible and by Jesus "bump up against" these laws and create tension for us. **What responsibilities do we have toward God? How do those responsibilities affect others? Can you think of situations when these could "bump up against" the laws of the land? Has this ever happened to you? If so, talk about it.**

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Paul knew that he belonged to God and that everything he did depended on God. Paul knew that his preaching of the gospel was not limited by human power, a mere matter of words. It was the Holy Spirit who gave him a message that moved hearts to hear and accept it. The prophet Isaiah reminded the exiles that God was creator of all, and therefore the fall and rise of nations was the work of God and not their own. It was God who unbarred the gates of tyranny and oppression. The reign of earthly monarchs was limited by the borders of their kingdoms, and they must submit themselves to God, the ruler of the universe: "I am the Lord and there is no other."

Jesus was sent by God to teach God's ways. Many tried to subvert his plan to lead the people out of darkness into the light of God's truth. Jesus knew that legitimate governments had their rights, but God's rights far surpass human sovereignty. "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's," he demanded. Taxes? Obedience? Loyalty? Yes, but give to God what rightfully belongs to God.

For Reflection: Do I realize that my life, my family, and my possessions really belong to God? Can I relinquish my hold over them and offer them to God's care?
