FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

During the exile, God must have seemed remote and uncaring. The prophet told them not to look up in the sky nor in the depths of the sea, as though God were mysterious and unattainable. God is very near to those who call. In times of trouble, their prayers will be heard and help will come.

In Jesus, God's reign is close at hand. Jesus is the image of God. In him, the invisible becomes visible. Jesus is the fullness and completeness of God's revelation. He is God's love, mercy, and peace incarnate. Through him, God reconciles a world dominated by the powers of evil. Jesus asks us to love God with everything that we possess—heart, soul, mind and strength. And he also asks us to love our neighbors in the same way that we love ourselves. Our neighbor is not only the person of our race or social standing. Our neighbor is the poor and suffering people we don't know, or even want to know. When we open our eyes to the wounded Christ in those we meet along our way, we will discover that all of humanity is our neighbor.

How have I shared God's care with someone I don't know? Who has been a neighbor to me in my needs?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

A Jewish legal expert tests Jesus by asking what he must do to inherit eternal life. After a process of question and counter question, the lawyer asks who one's neighbor is. In reply, Jesus tells the story of the good Samaritan, a story in which a Samaritan is the neighbor — the hero of the story! And because, at that time, Samaritans and Jews were enemies, it was really hard for the lawyer to accept this teaching. The lesson here is that the love of neighbor embraces all, Samaritan, Jew — everyone.

Do you see your neighbor in people of different color or race? How can you make them feel that they are your neighbor?

AUTOMATIC PAY: How many times have you missed church and planned to send your contribution for that week later and it never happens? I know it happened to me a lot. I finally set St. Charles up on automatic pay from the bank. I never need to write a check and never miss a week of donation. If you already do a monthly donation, it can be done automatically. However you would like to set it up—the bank can help you with that. We currently only have a few people who do their giving this way and in the summer we notice a big decrease in giving because people are away from home and forget their donations, but the needs of the parish continue in the summer also. This is just a thought for people to consider on managing their contribution to the parish. Thanks for considering this.

This represents a **1 million dollar** investment in Cully! If your home does qualify, any repairs you choose to make are paid thru on-bill financing and the cost to you will be the same as your current utility bill!
