FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

The prophet Isaiah offered consolation to a people weary of being in exile. All those who mourned over the destruction of Jerusalem would one day be comforted, as a mother comforts her child, holding it tenderly in her lap. Then they would know that the Lord was with them in their grief.

Jesus sent his disciples to announce the good news that God's reign had arrived in their midst. They must travel lightly and announce Christ's peace to all who would listen. Jesus knew that the road ahead would be difficult and that his disciples would meet opposition. Not everyone heard the message they proclaimed. There were many who opposed the gospel of grace and mercy. Jesus' disciples had to learn to trust God and one another every step of the journey.

Paul declared that there is nothing we can do to earn God's reign. Instead of looking at our own merits, he points us to the cross. When our suffering is united to Christ, darkness and evil are defeated. Mourning days are over; it is time to rejoice.

Jesus asked for more workers so that the harvest would be fruitful. Am I willing to answer the call?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

Jesus wants the whole world to know that the Kingdom of God is at hand. So, he sends his disciples out to gather the harvest (harvest means people who have not heard the Good News of the Gospel). He tells the disciples they must go quickly and travel light.

How many disciples did Jesus have at that time? (72). How many disciples do you think we have today? (probably millions). As a disciple of Jesus, what are you doing to let people know about Jesus' love and the Kingdom of God?

MACG WINS CULLY WEATHERIZATION OUTREACH AND MANAGEMENT CONTRACT:

This is wonderful news for MACG and St. Charles as we are the institution within the Cully Neighborhood! This project, contracted through Clean Energy Works of Portland will implement the weatherization and energy-upgrade retrofits of 100 homes in our community. This represents a **1 million dollar** investment in Cully! As members of MACG, our Cully residents have the 1st chance to sign up for the free energy audit that will determine if their home qualifies. If your home does qualify, any repairs you choose to make are paid thru on-bill financing and the cost to you will be the same as your current utility bill!
