ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The psalmist declared: "Happy the one to whom the Lord imputes no guilt." Each of us wishes that those words could be said of us. But whether we are kings or commoners, we know that we sin. David knew he committed the sin of adultery with his commander's wife. But he compounded his sin when he covered it up and put the soldier's life in peril. When the man was killed, the prophet confronted David, not by listing his sins but by recounting God's blessings to him.

Paul knew that no one was justified by good deeds but only by the mercy and grace of God. Paul admitted that his mortal flesh was crucified with Christ. He knew that the life he lived was not his own but the life of Christ living in him. Therefore, he could never treat God's gracious gift as meaningless.

The ostentatious religious leaders tried to win Christ's favor by wining and dining him. But it was a sinful woman who gave him the most precious gift: oil poured out to anoint him and tears shed in remorse for her offense. Her faith was her salvation.

Am I conscious of my need for forgiveness? Am I willing to forgive the faults of others?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

In this gospel, a sinful woman enters the home where Jesus is eating. She begins crying, washes his feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, then breaks a jar full of oil and anoints his feet with it. A Pharisee says that if Jesus were really a prophet, he would know that this woman is a sinner! Jesus tells a parable which shows that God's love and forgiveness is offered to all people, whether they have sinned a little or a lot! Our response to this love and forgiveness is to love God.

Think about times when you have done something wrong or hurtful. How does it feel to know that God forgives you? How do you show your love for Jesus?
