ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: The self-righteous do not see others as having worth, especially those they suppose to be sinners. As Jesus dined in the home of a Pharisee, a woman entered the room and anointed Jesus with oil, weeping in gratitude for the forgiveness she received. By contrast, the Pharisee was not conscious of any need for repentance, therefore he received no forgiveness.

“That man is you!” The prophet Nathan charged King David of stealing from a poor man’s flock, but David laid the blame on someone else. That indictment could as easily be leveled at us. In our efforts to justify ourselves, we are found to be sinners. When we pour out our love in generous service to others, in spite of our many sins, we are pardoned. The debt for our sins has been paid by Jesus, and we can love all the more.

Am I grateful for the mercy God has shown to me? What acts of kindness is the Lord asking me to do today?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

In this gospel, a sinful woman enters the home where Jesus is eating. She begins crying, washes his feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, then breaks a jar full of oil and anoints his feet with it. A Pharisee says that if Jesus were really a prophet, he would know that this woman is a sinner! Jesus tells a parable which shows that God’s love and forgiveness is offered to all people, whether they have sinned a little or a lot! Our response to this love and forgiveness is to love God.

Think about times when you have done something wrong or hurtful. How does it feel to know that God forgives you?

How do you show your love for Jesus?
