**TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:**

When we lament in our search for God's mercy, the spirit of compassion is poured forth. Though we have sinned, divine blessings flow from the fountain of grace to cleanse us from sin.

Drenched in new life, we are clothed with Christ's identity. At the table of the Lord we are brothers and sisters, one people, one family. There can be no division among us: no racism, no classism, and no sexism. All are one in Christ.

Understanding who we are in Christ takes time. Just as gradually, we come to an awareness of who Christ is to us. We may discuss, argue, and ask many questions, but in the end it is the grace of God that illuminates our understanding. When we hear Christ ask, "And you, who do you say that I am?" we can't depend on someone else to answer. Each of us must declare for ourselves: "You are the Christ, God's anointed servant. You are the Lord!"

Who is Jesus Christ to you? Who do you think you are to him?

**FAMILY FAITH SHARING:** We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

In this gospel, Jesus invites us to reflect on his question, "who do you say I am?" He then warns his disciples about the suffering he would endure, as will all who follow him.

***Imagine Jesus is asking you, "who do you say I am?" Why do you think Jesus would ask such a question? What do you think Jesus means when he says, "You must not think about yourself?" In what ways is serving others also a way of thinking of yourself?***
