THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

When we say to Christ, "I will follow you wherever you go," are we willing to go with him when the way is difficult or the destination unknown? Are we able to follow him to the cross? Does everything take second place to being his disciple? Jesus tells us that once we "put our hands to the plow," we must move forward and not look back.

Jesus' disciples failed to understand this. They avoided the way of love by wanting to "call down fire from heaven" on those who traveled a different path. Discipleship doesn't mean forcing everyone to be like us. It means resisting the tendency to be selfish and pouring out our lives for the sake of others. When we follow Jesus' way of love, we become servants to one another. Then, when we invite others to follow a similar path, they will be willing to do so.

Do I follow Christ only when the way is easy? What price have I paid for living my Christian life?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem. He forgives the Samaritans who refuse to welcome him, showing his disciples how to behave toward their enemies. He then responds to three different people who want to follow him. Jesus tells them right up front the high cost of becoming a disciple. That cost may include giving up home, family and means of income.

Imagine Jesus saying to you, "Come follow me now, without delay." What would be your first concerns? What is it like for you to follow Jesus? Do you have to give something up?
