THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

Becoming Saints of God may seem to be an impossible quest. But giving just one cup of water to another person brings an irrevocable reward. Elijah the prophet asked a poor widow for a cup of water and a bit of bread. It was the middle of a drought, and she and her son were on the verge of starvation, but she obeyed. The prophet calmed her fears; God cannot be outdone in generosity. God secures justice for the oppressed, provides food for the hungry, heals the afflicted, and uplifts those bowed down by adversity.

Jesus contrasted those who served for personal gain with a humble widow who assisted others in gratitude for the little she had. While the rich gave from their surplus wealth, she gave from her sustenance.

Jesus is our model of self-giving. In life he poured himself out through his service to all who were in need. In his death he offered his own blood in expiation for sin. As high priest in the heavenly sanctuary, Jesus continues to intercede on our behalf.

***Do I withhold my resources from those in need?
How much am I willing to serve God today?***

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

The first reading from Kings and the Gospel from Mark tell stories of widows. Both widows are poor, but generous. They believed that they were doing what God wanted them to do.

Think of a time when you gave something to someone. Were you generous with your gift? Did you give as much as you could, or did you give a little so that you would have lots left over for yourself?

When you have money, how do you spend it? Do you remember to include God (the church) in your giving? If you were one of the characters in today's gospel story, what would Jesus say about you?
