MASS OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

On Sat., Nov. 7, at 11 a.m., we will offer a special mass focused on this sacrament. We are inviting all members of our parish, who would like to receive this sacrament to attend this mass. Anyone who is seriously sick, either physically or emotionally, should consider this opportunity. Also, anyone who is of retirement age, and is in danger of serious illness, anyone who is going in for a potentially dangerous operation or procedure, anyone suffering from a seriously debilitating physical problem or emotional condition is eligible for this sacrament. This sacrament is not a sacrament of "the almost dead," or "last rites", it is a sacrament to help those who are sick. Let us come together and help each other with the gift of this sacrament.

SWINE FLU EPIDEMIC: 10 things to know—

6. Immunity takes awhile. Even those first in line for shots won't have immunity until around Thanksgiving. That's because it's likely to take two shots, given three weeks apart, to provide protection. And it takes a week or two after the last shot for the vaccine to take full effect. The regular seasonal flu shot is already widely available. People 50 and older are urged to get that shot.

TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

If we are honest, most of us would want others to serve us rather than our serving others. James and John didn't want to be lowly servants; they wanted positions of power and glory. It wasn't a polite, "May we, please?" but "We want you to grant our request." Jesus knew that they didn't understand what it meant to be his followers. Unbelievers may exercise authority by trying to "lord it over" others, but if they want to aspire to greatness, they must serve others as Jesus did. Being a disciple means radical self-denial and self-sacrifice, sharing the cup of Jesus' suffering and being immersed in his bath of pain.

Jesus doesn't stand aloof from our sinful nature. He knows what temptation is like. He is like the Jewish high priest who entered the temple sanctuary to intercede for the sins of the people. Because Jesus sympathizes with our human weakness, we can confidently approach God, trusting in divine mercy whenever we are in need. The psalmist reminds us that God's "eyes" are on those who stand in awe of God's ways.

Am I a willing servant of my family and community?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

Two of Jesus' apostles ask to be given the seats beside him in the glory of heaven. Jesus tells them they do not realize what it is they are asking, and then he asks them whether they can go through everything he will go through. They say they can. Jesus responds by telling them they will go through those things, but that he cannot give them the places of honor in heaven because those places are already reserved. Jesus calls the apostles together and explains to them that although the rulers in the world are harsh and demanding leaders, the followers of Jesus who wish to be great should be a servant and a slave to others. He says, "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

What did Jesus do to show that he was a servant to others? How can you be a servant, too? A 'ransom' is payment made to rescue or save someone. What ransom did Jesus make? Who was he rescuing?
