TWENTY SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

TWENTY SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:

When Moses became exhausted by the constant demands and complaints of the people on their wilderness journey, God poured out gifts on the community, and 70 elders began to prophesy! But two "outsiders" also spoke God's words, and Joshua insisted that they be stopped. Moses confronted this man who would one day lead the people to the Promised Land. Was Joshua jealous on account of Moses or for his own sake? Moses opposed him saying, "Would that the Lord might bestow his gifts on them all!" The psalmist pleads, "Cleanse me from my unknown faults."

James challenged the hidden sin in every community, the powerful who lived in luxury and withheld just wages from the harvesters of crops while the poor had no power to resist. The sins committed against them reach the ears of the Lord of Justice.

Jesus had stern words for those who hoarded power for themselves. He vigorously expelled the demons of pride and greed from among them. "If your hand is in someone else's pocket, take it out! If your foot is on someone's neck, get it off! If your eye lusts after what does not belong to you, tear that eye out!" If we want to enter God's reign "whole" and "holy," we had better eradicate such sins from our midst.

Have I examined myself for remnants of pride, greed and jealousy?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING: We encourage parents to reflect on these questions at home each week with their children and family. Start talking. Share your faith!

When Jesus' disciples tell him that they saw someone using his name to cast out demons and they tried to stop him because he was not part of their group, Jesus tells them not to worry because someone who does great things in his name cannot be his enemy. He says 'whoever is not against us is for us.' Jesus also tells them that anyone who does something nice for them because they are his followers will be rewarded because of it. But that anyone who causes one of his followers, especially children, to sin, will be severely punished. Jesus warns the disciples to get rid of anything in their lives that causes them to sin. He uses dramatic examples, like cutting off a hand or foot, to show that sometimes the things we need to get out of our lives can seem to be very important and necessary for us.

Jesus' words today can teach us about our friendships. What did he mean by the words 'whoever is not against us is for us'? How are we rewarded (or punished) for the way we treat others? You may have a friend who wants you to do things you know are wrong. What does Jesus say you should do?
